







# THE ENTHRONEMENT OF YANGSI RINPOCHE IN PRAISE OF TENZIN

The three ceremonial occasions (the actual Enthronement, the Reception, and a Puja beginning in the morning and included the entire Sera Monastery) were, by far, the most significantly important and logistically massive event ever to be organised and fundraised by anyone at TBI. Gigantic and colossal in every way, these three events were only triumphant because our Chanzoe and Director, Nawang Thubten (affectionately called Tenzin) had the incredible skill, fortitude, determination, resilience and endurance to pull it off. His vast knowledge of Sera Monastery, the intricate workings involved in traditional ceremonies and procedures, and his impressively inspiring organisational abilities, were learned from sitting at the feet of our Precious Rinpoche so many, many years ago. Tenzin, even as a young 19yo, had the ability to organise Rinpoche's overseas trips for him to teach in various countries, arrange overseas Lama's to come and visit and teach at TBI, plan and achieve highly successful retreats, etc etc. All this history culminated in a never to be forgotten Enthronement ceremony, lasting three days. Hence "Ritual Master" is what Ilia named Tenzin some years ago. This Enthronement was always going to be gargantuan...........an enormously immense occasion, and this is exactly what it was!

Geshes and their attendants arrived from overseas and interstate and included over 3,000 Sera Jey monks, all in attendance and receiving the many food offerings which were in abundance, as well as the traditional monetary offerings to everyone who was present.

The traditional lunch was a lavish and delicious affair, with a touch of humour as the young monks sprinted up and down the 30 or more rows eager to dish out the meals without spilling a drop. Every detail of this major event, was a perfect presentation of this most holy and blessed rite of passage for our cherished and beloved Khensur Rinpoche, whose family also attended, coming down to Sera from Ladhak. One can only wonder that they must have been in awe of such ceremonial splendour honouring their son. In amongst all the grandeur and celebrations, a highlight for the TBI students who attended was the teachings given to us by Geshe Yama Rinchen and Geshe Chime Tsering, in the Prayer Hall in Rinpoches Labrang. Tenzin fulfilled all the needs of the Aussie visitors to perfection:- flights to and from India, accommodation in Bangalore and in Sera, a visit to the Health Care Centre in Sera, a visit to five nearby monasteries, a tour of the massive kitchen in Sera whilst the cooks were preparing for the feast the following day. Tenzin also ensured that two exceptional cooks supplied an endless feast (there was at least six or more choices for breakfast .....really!!) three times a day for the Aussies! He organised our stay in the Sera Mey Guest House, and we enjoyed a short walk to Rinpoche's house every morning. For the actual Enthronement, he gave us instructions on what to do and what not to do, guiding us gently through what we were so privileged to be a part of. His mind of course was on the enormity of having the Enthronement itself being perfect, as befitted our Cherished Rinpoche, but still he was thinking of us.

I have seen Tenzin organise many events for TBI: several 10 day retreats, weekend teachings, visiting Geshes and Lamas (including His Holiness 14th Dalai Lama to our centre), Sakya Trizin, Dagri Rinpoche, Geshe Yama Rinchen) but the Enthronement of his Guru and Mentor, his heart teacher and his Spiritual Advisor was perhaps his most magnificent achievement to date. Thoughts on our pilgrimage to the Heart of Sera Je Monastery, so much more than a few mere words can describe!

Being able to participate in a very small way, in the magnificent ceremonies honouring Kyabje Khensur Kangyur Lama Lobsang Thubten Rinpoche's return as Yangsi Chotrul Kangyur Rinpoche was a profound privilege, connecting again with my Guru and observing how he is so loved and highly esteemed. Also, meeting with Tenzin Ogyen Chonyid Rinpoche, the reincarnation of Khensur Rinpoche's teacher, seeing the bond between him and Yangsi Chotrul Kangyur Rinpoche, was a very special experience. As a Western nun, I felt more of an observer than a participant in the Enthronement ceremonies, it was a bit like looking through a window and knowing I could not be inside! Although ordained, my life in the Western world, is vastly different to what I observed for the monastics at Sera Je Monastery. I was profoundly aware of contrasts - the austerities of the physical lives of the monks in the monastery, contrasting with the richness of opportunities to listen, reflect and meditate. Every day (except Tuesdays) the monks, from a very young age, are immersed in the Dharma - such a contrast with the Western nuns who materially are rich, but struggle often in isolation, to be immersed in the teachings.

The system of responsibility for the education and welfare of Yangsi Chotrul Kangyur Rinpoche greatly impressed me; he will be guided by many, including Tenzin and the residents at his Khangsten and Labrang. Connecting again with Geshe Yama Rinchen, Rinpoche's Senior tutor and meeting his Junior tutor Geshe Chemi Tsering, I felt blessed to have such connections and, although aware of the contrasts, being there in that great monastery, I felt joy being in the right place and all the petty worries of the outside world faded away.

To mention just a few moments of joy, such as observing little Rinpoche playing with Carole, Steven and others in the group; having the poignant use for our daily practice of Rinpoche's Gompa and the generosity and care shown by Tenzin's three "golden" helpers, Rabjay, Geshes Jamyang and Chogye (this included electric kettles being provided at the guesthouse on request)! The thoughtfulness for our pilgrimage group was kindness itself, headed up by Tenzin-la who is held in such high esteem, as noted when he was almost buried under a mound of offered khatas at the Enthronement! And, of course, Rinpoche on his throne, seated for hours with complete composure, it was obvious that he also was in the right place, surrounded by his students, family and devoted friends. May it always be so!

Now that Rinpoche has returned to us, I feel he is reaching out with hands of compassion and, having faith in our Guru, we can be guided by the Dharma teachings from an unbroken lineage, teacher to student, back through to Sakyamuni Buddha himself. How fortunate is that! By Tenzin Drolkar
